Total main stage attendance: 138,494.

Student attendance at Playhouse main stage, education and outreach programs: 57,354.

Number of subscribers: 13,176, the highest of any nonprofit regional theatre in Ohio, Kentucky or Indiana.

Combined main stage attendance over the past two seasons for single and group ticket sales increased by 30 percent versus the previous two seasons combined.

Celebrating its 25th anniversary, A Christmas Carol played to the highest total attendance of the past 15 seasons.




