DRAMA INTEGRATION WORKSHOPS BRINGING BOOKS TO LIFE

Through a fun-filled, immersive five-day workshop, engage your students in the power of dramatic and visual storytelling that will deepen their reading comprehension and critical analysis skills. Fables and Folktales

Bring to life through the eyes of your students the stories that have been passed through generations. Through this interactive process, students will create characters from the descriptions in the folktale. The workshop will end in a presentation that brings together the most important aspects of theatre.

The Tortoise & the Hare

Aesop's beloved fable tells the sweet story of opposites and friendship. Students will explore Hare and Tortoise's world — from sun-shining spring to snow-falling winter in this workshop based on imagination, characters and physicality.

The Snowy Day

Students will spend five days creating their own snowy world that's full of imagination. They will work to reenact their favorite scenes from the book and use their bodies, voices and imagination to create their own snowy day experiences.

Dragons Love Tacos

Students will step into their own dragon character. They will focus on movements, objectives and moments from the story to generate their own version of this funny tale.

Lilly's Purple Plastic Purse

Students will outline the story, tell it through their bodies, make a personal connection to the text and work as an ensemble to recreate moments from this book about a mouse who learns the importance of sharing time.

Green Eggs and Ham

Celebrate this timeless classic with a five-day workshop that allows students to outline the events in the book, create physical pictures and work as an ensemble to bring the silly story to life.

Where the Wild Things Are

Students will work as an ensemble to dissect the story, become their own wild thing and recreate memorable events from the book.

Lilly's Purple Plastic Purse

Students will outline the story, tell it through their bodies, make a personal connection to the text and work as an ensemble to recreate moments from this book about a mouse who learns the importance of sharing time.

The Wind in the Willows

Engage your students in a five-day workshop with a story of Toad and his love of motorcars. Students will transform their bodies and voices into the animals, and they will build their own theatre piece based on the beloved characters' relationships and adventures.

Junie B. Jones Is (almost) a Flower Girl

Follow the tales of June B. Jones during this workshop about story comprehension. Students will work with text from the books, step inside the physicality of the characters and present their own retelling.

Anansi and the Moss-Covered Rock

Students will create their own version of this famous folktale by embodying the animals, picking their environment and using their imaginations to create objects within their made-up world. This workshop culminates with the students performing their own retelling of this story about a sneaky spider.

Snow White

Travel to the enchanted forest with your students in this workshop based on the fairy tale of Snow White. Students will transform their bodies and voices into the characters from this beloved story, and they will build their own theatre piece based on the characters' relationships and magical journeys.

DRAMA INTEGRATION WORKSHOPS PUBLIC SPEAKING

Empower students to create effective conversations. Students will learn to identify key details of a story/text and develop vocal techniques for oral presentations. Nursery Rhymes

Students will take texts from favorite nursery rhymes and learn the tools needed for public speaking inside and outside of the classroom. They will have the opportunity to retell their favorite poems while practicing the do's and don'ts of speaking in front of an audience. This workshop focuses on building confidence and connecting emotion to words. At the end the week, students will share the nursery rhymes they have been practicing with each other.

Fables and Folktales

This workshop takes texts from your favorite fable or folktales and introduces the tools needed for public speaking inside and outside the classroom. Students will practice the do's and don'ts of speaking in front of an audience, focus on building confidence and connecting emotion to text and end the week with a presentation of the text.

The Poetry of Shel Silverstein: "Put Something In"

Engage your students with the magical words of Shel Silverstein. Students will learn to read with expression, use sound and movement to retell the poem "Put Something In" and gain an understanding of how to convey the author's intent. The workshop will culminate in a memorized sharing of the selected poem using applied drama techniques.



One Day Enrichment: Public Speaking

Empower students to create effective conversations by investigating the habits of good speech. Students will learn to identify the key details of a text and develop vocal and physical techniques for oral presentations. Please note: This class can be found in our Enrichment Day selection.

Wonder

The Poetry of Shel Silverstein: Whatif

Take a journey with one of world's most beloved writers, Shel Silverstein. Students will work to physically portray the poem The Whatif from Silverstein's book, Where the Sidewalk Ends. They will interpret the text, create moving pictures, connect emotionally to the words, and culminate in a sharing of this poems.

The BFG

Engage your students in the power of reading comprehension and literary interpretation through dramatic storytelling. Through writing and performance exercises, your students will interpret Roald Dahl's structure and descriptive language as they write and stage scenes from the novel, create monologues as the characters, and create a retelling of Sophie's magical adventure.



Bridge to Terabithia

Engage your students in the power of reading comprehension and literary interpretation through this dramatic storytelling workshop. Through writing and performance exercises, your students will interpret Katherine Paterson's structure and descriptive language as they write and stage scenes from the novel, create monologues as the characters, and create a retelling of Jesse and Leslie's creation of the magical kingdom, Terabithia.

DRAMA SPECIALS WORKSHOPS **VIDEO SERIES**

All the world's a stage! Our Drama Specials workshops are designed for students and classrooms interested in learning more about specific aspects of the theatre. In our five-session workshops, a trained Playhouse teaching artist will share their knowledge about these specialized topics including movement, character creation, acting, and playwriting. Below are our current offerings for grades K-12.

MUSICAL THEATRE

Pop Musical Theatre Singing

In this five-session workshop, students will explore the basic tools of the voice that every performer needs for healthy vocal production. Focusing on contemporary musical theatre repertoire, students will learn skills in Breath and Enunciation, among others, and will cover the vocal riffs and runs popular in this style of musical theatre.



Classic Musical Theatre Singing

Students will spend five sessions investigating the vocal tools needed for healthy singing while learning to perform a collection of classic musical theatre songs. This series of classes will cover the tools of Ear Training, Performance Techniques, and Execution of Skills, among others.

Contemporary Musical Theatre Dance

Contemporary Musical Theatre Dance encompasses dances seen in musicals produced since the 1990's, which incorporate more pop, rock, and hip-hop influences. Students will learn these styles and various dance combinations in this five-session workshop.



Classic Musical Theatre Dance

Students will dive into Classical Musical Theatre Dance and learn new dance combinations in the style of the Golden Age of Musicals. Technique will be rooted heavily in ballet, tap, and jazz.

MOVEMENT

Stage Combat

Each day of this action-packed curriculum focuses on the skills and body awareness you need properly perform combat onstage. In this series, students will use their imaginations to portray duels, attacks, and falls while keeping control of their bodies to stay safe.

Action Movement

Action and reaction: how do characters respond to varied situations and stimuli? Explore heightened character movement in this five-session class that has students moving with purpose and building action scenes.

Character Movement

Discover how actors use their bodies to create believable characters in this five-session course. Storytelling, movement, and imagination combine in this class that dives into the specificity of character action and how to create deeper characters through movement.

ACTING AND CHARACTER WORK

Acting

This five-session workshop will give young actors the tools they need to soar! Rooted in an imaginary wizarding world, actors will learn about ensemble, objectives, and scene work while discovering how to use their voice and body to portray characters.

Improv

Quick thinking and humor combine in this fast-paced class that will keep you on your toes! Students will learn the basics of Improv including saying yes, objectives, and stakes, while participating in games and exercises designed to exercise the imagination.

Character Creation

Through playwriting, monologue writing, character study, and guided journey, students will create and explore animal characters. Each day focuses on a key element for actors to create and portray characters realistically.

COSTUME CRAFTS AND DESIGN

Costume Design

In this five-session class, students will learn all about costume design, including using color, texture, silhouette and proportion to design costumes, and will use materials found at home to create awesome character costumes including a superhero, a robot, and a dragonfly, and more.

Mask Making

Engage your students in a five-day workshop on the creative art of mask making. Over the course of the sessions, students will learn how to make five different styles of masks, each for a different character: Animals, Mardi Gras, Super Hero, Robot, and a Duck made from a hat!

Puppet Making

Puppets come in many styles and colors and the ones in this class are no different! Students will spend five session creating a variety of puppets from household and crafting materials. Shadow puppets, finger puppets, handkerchief puppets, sock puppets, and marionettes will all be explored in this interactive, creative class.

Theatre Make-Up

Students will step into the world of character design through makeup in this five session class. Zombies, clowns, animals and more will make appearances as make-up design techniques are taught for each one. Put on a different perspective with this fun, creative class.

WRITING AND CREATING THEATRE

Playwriting

Students will unleash their imaginations while creating new worlds and ideas. In this workshop, they will explore essential elements of playwriting: Monologues, Dialogue, Environment, Character Creation, and Scene Writing.

Transformation Theatre

If given a one word prompt, what would you create? In this five-session class, students will given daily prompts used to explore thoughts, sounds, movement, words, and ultimately create a short devised theatre piece. Students will use their imagination to transform themselves into other objects based on that initial word.
